Scholar/Artist in Residence — Every year Congregation Kol Tikvah brings in a scholar who spends an entire weekend enriching our congregation. ***Our Scholar in Residence weekend will be February 2-4, 2018.*** This years theme will continue to explore Life's Sacred Journey.

Tentative dates of programs are Wednesday, March 14, 2018 and Wednesday, May 2, 2018.

Life's Sacred Journey — To provide a primary resource for congregants that addresses the issues, concerns, challenges, and milestones of mid-life, baby boomers and seniors. Our approach will be three pronged: First, our clergy will provide spiritual support applying the lessons derived from the wealth of literature of our tradition. Second, in alliance with expert professionals and local social service organizations, we will provide access to practical guidance. Third, through support and dialogue within our Kol Tikvah community, participants will benefit from shared experience and wisdom.

Yom HaShoah — Each year, on Yom HaShoah, Holocaust Remembrance Day, Kol Tikvah presents a speaker. As long as there are still actual survivors alive to share their stories, every effort is made to bring a survivor to speak.

Yom HaZikaron/Yom Ha'Atzmaut
(Sponsored by ARZA and Broward Israeli Citizens — Every year, our congregation hosts the local Yom HaZikaron service. Organized by a group of Israelis who currently live in Florida, this extremely moving service pays tribute to fallen soldiers of all of Israel's wars, and to victims of terrorism in Israel. With prayers and song, poetry and candle lighting, this service brings together Jews of all walks of life honoring so many lives which ended too soon. Following the ceremony, we join in a joyous celebration of Israel's independence.

Tikun Leil Shavuot — A yearly tradition on the eve of Shavuot, in keeping with the mitzvah of engaging in Jewish study prior to the giving of the Torah at Mount Sinai, members of the congregation are invited to teach a 5-10 minute lesson on a topic of their choice. Chevruta, camaraderie, and cheesecake round out the evening.

Bagels and Bible — Rabbi Boxman and Cantor Arnold lead discussions on **Shabbat mornings from 8:45 am-9:45 am** all year round on Parashat Ha-shavuah, the weekly Torah portion. Participants share a light breakfast together and enjoy an informal and educational discussion on the Parashah of the week before morning worship services. No prior knowledge is necessary and all are welcome who have a desire to learn and be spiritually nourished by the wisdom of the Torah.

Talmud 101.9 — This year, the class will be studying the Responsa Literature of past ages and most especially of the Reform Movement known in Hebrew as Sh'aylot V't'shuvot. These are the collected halachic responses to questions posed by scholars and lay people alike on moral questions as well as proper ritual practices. We will look at a wide variety of Responsa spanning the last two centuries up to the modern day. Registration is required. **This class meets on Thursdays from 12:00 pm to 1:00 pm.**

Adult Confirmation — Jewish adults who want to “confirm” and “affirm” what it means for themselves to identify as Jews in a meaningful and intentional way are invited to join the Adult Confirmation class. Through a commitment to becoming a lifelong Jewish learner, the Adult Confirmand will commit to a minimum of 100 hours of Jewish learning to be completed by November 2019. Through study, worship and the giving of ourselves for the greater good, the Adult Confirmand will enrich his/her life with deep spiritual meaning and will grow ever closer to not only living Torah but in embodying its essence in all that we do.

Adult B'nai Mitzvah — This course is based upon three areas of primary Jewish concern: The study of Torah, the worship of God and the practice of loving deeds. The course is designed to maximize flexibility for busy adults enabling students to individualize their preparation for Bar/Bat Mitzvah and to encourage chevruta or fellowship among the students who will share this spiritual milestone together. Adult B'nai Mitzvah will take place from October 2017 to February 2019.
